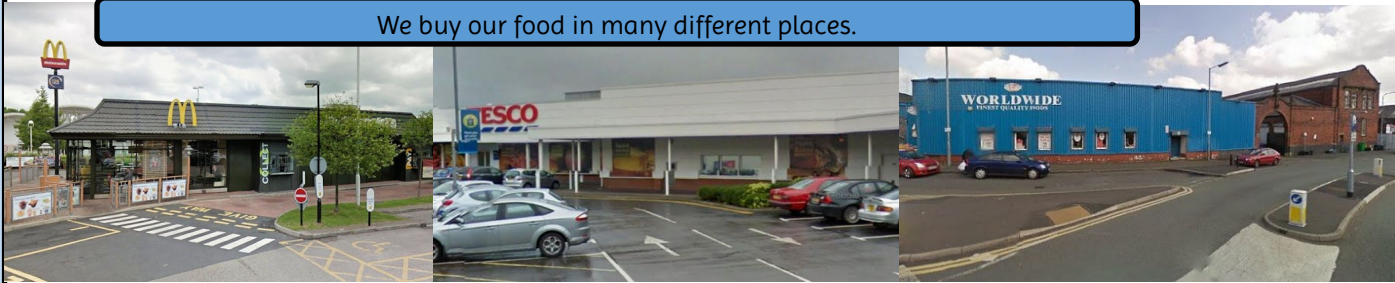


Ashfield Valley Primary School– Year 2—Geography- Where does are food come from?

Key Knowledge

- We have lots of shops nearby where we can buy food. The nearest to our school is a corner shop that sells bread, milk, fruit and lots of other foods.

- Different foods are grown in different parts of the country depending on the type of land.

Key vocabulary

Supermarket—a large shop where there is a big choice of different foods.

Corner shop— a small shop selling different foods in usually where there are lots of houses.

Farm—a place where food is produced such as vegetables, fruit or where animals are kept that are used to produce food.

Dairy— foods made from milk that comes from cows such as yoghurt, cheese and butter.

Arable— foods grown on farms such as wheat, oats and barley used to make flour and cereals.
