- There are seven continents- North America, South America, Europe, Africa, Asia, Oceania and Antarctica.
- The Alps run through- France, Germany, Switzerland, Austria, Italy and Slovenia.
- The Eurasian and African plates meet under the Mediterranean Sea.
- The Alps were formed over 30 million years ago when the two plates moved towards each other. This made fold mountains.
- In the Alps, the temperature can drop to 10°C (14°F) in winter and rise to 30°C (86°F) in summer.
- Tourism is an important industry in the Alps.
- Natural disasters have an effect on the Alps e.g avalanches.
- There are 3 types of avalanche -wet, powder and slab
- Homes are adapted to the environment so they can keep warm in the winter and cool in the summer.
