Look at the labels on food packaging. Where is the food produced?

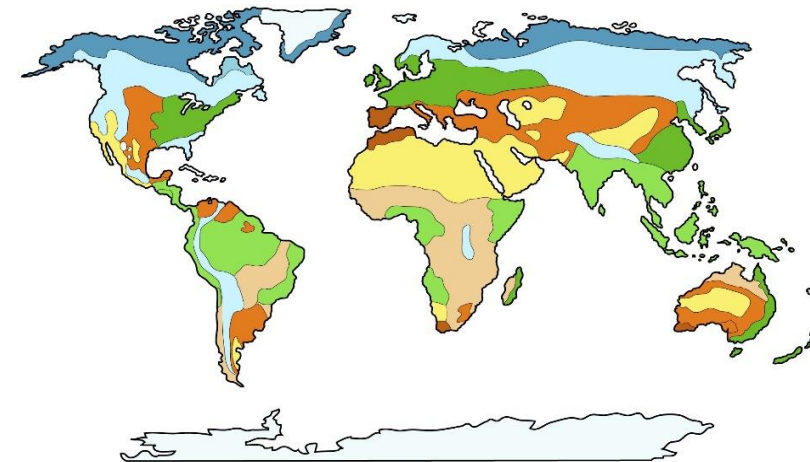
Vocabulary
