Spring—March, April, May

Summer—June, July, August

Autumn –September, October, November

Winter—December, January, February

- The weather patterns are different in each seasons.
- A weather forecast is a statement saying what the weather will be like today, the next day or for the next few days.
- Weather forecasts use different symbols which



are helpful.

- When the weather changes, you need to wear the correct clothing and do different activities.
- You can record the temperature using a thermometer to see how warm or cold it is.

weather—The atmosphere in a place and time.

seasons— The four different times of the year.

spring—The season after winter and before summer.

summer—The season after spring and before autumn.

autumn— The season after summer and before winter.

winter— The season after autumn and before spring.

weather forecast—What the weather is like today, tomorrow or in the next few days.

rain— Water falling from the clouds in small drops, sometimes light or heavy.

sun—A star that provides light and heat to the Earth.

wind—A current of air moving a cross the Earth's surface.

thunder—A loud noise that comes form the sky during a storm.

snow- Small pieces of ice that fall from the sky when it is cold.

cloudy— When the sky is full of clouds whci can make it seem darker.

thermometer –We use this to measure how hot or cold it is.

United Kingdom—Where we live . It is made up of 4 countries—England, Scotland , Northern Ireland and Wales.
