Key knowledge

- The stone age lasted about 3.4 million years. It is split into three parts.
 The Palaeolithic period, the Mesolithic period and the Neolithic period.
- We can learn about the people who lived during the Stone Age from the artefacts that they left behind.
- Over the three periods of the Stone Age, people developed new skills, made communities. They even created jobs such as farmers, hunters, priest and society leaders.
